To promote sidecar trial competition, the M/C I7 Club believe that an Inter-Contro Team Sidecar Trial would be very popular. As is very obvious one of the biggest drawbacks would be the mileage involved in travelling to the event by some competitors.

We propose that there be 4 sidecar outfits, with the best 3 to count, otherwise very similar to the I.G. J.T. as it now exists.

If this proposal is considered an idea worth pursuing I will draft some Regulations.

As the instigators of the venture our Club could hold the first event, after which any Club could volunteer to hold it ". Yours etc

This idea has since gathered momentum to such effect that on March 28th we will organise - The Ist Inter Centre Sidecar Team Trial. The event will start from the Fourways Diner at IO.30 am, and it is likely that I5 teams will enter. Sixty outfits with the best crews in Britain must make an interesting competition. If anyone can help with this event and help set it on the road to success please contact myself or any Committee Member.
