Edgar Trophy Scoring system and remuneration

[1] Eligibility:- any rider, of any class, riding the hardest available route in any of this years three road trials as listed above.

[2] All 3 rounds to count to the final points total.

[3] Scoring:- in order of position: 20,17,15,13,11,10,9,8,7,6,5,4,3,2,1.

[4] The rider with greatest number of points at end of series receives:- The Edgar trophy and replica + £400.00 2nd receives £200.00

[5] In the event of tie the winner is:- a rider whose total points are derived from this years three events. If this fails to resolves the tie then it is the rider whose scores have been derived from the highest positions in the trials entered.

ABOUT THE MAN WHOSE NAME IS ON THE TROPHY

The EDGAR Trophy is a replica of a late 'Victorian Cricket Presentation Cup' and stands 360 mm height. Edgar always liked the traditional silverware of this period.

Edgar held at different times from the early seventies, to his death in 2006, the following positions in the Manchester 17 :- President, Treasurer, Trials Secretary, Enduro Secretary and served as one of the ACU spokesman for the Cheshire Centre on land rights issues in the 70/s. In addition he was at one time President of the Cheshire & N.Wales Centre of the ACU

Edgar was an enthusiastic observer and would observe at nearly all the trials that he attended, not a burden to him as he enjoyed it. Edgar very much liked being part of the motorcycling community, not bad for a man who never rode motorcycle and didn't know what one was until the early 1960's...."

The Trophies and prize money payments are funded by a legacy given to the club by Edgar for this purpose.
